Chairman Dirlam called the meeting to order at 1:06 p.m. Attendance was recorded.

#### Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Jerry Scott made a motion to accept the October 21, 2021, minutes as distributed. Secretary Keis seconded the motion and it carried.

#### Correspondence

There was no correspondence.

#### Project Review Report

There were no new projects since the last Board meeting.

#### **Executive Director's Report**

#### 1. Federal Funding

The House passed the bipartisan infrastructure package, sending it to the White House. The legislation contains several provisions affecting ARC, including the following:

- \$1 billion over five years (\$200 million per year, starting in FY22) for ARC generally. This is in addition to ARC's regular appropriation. There are no congressional directions on how the money will be allocated. (The pending House and Senate FY22 regular appropriation bills both provide \$210 million for ARC, along with congressional directions.);
- Reauthorizes ARC for five years and changes the agency's sunset date to October 1, 2026.
  - Adds three counties to ARC (Catawba and Cleveland in NC and Union in SC).
  - Creates a new regional energy hub initiative, authorized at \$5 million per year, that cansupport, through research and grants, an ethane storage facility.
  - Reworks ARC's existing broadband authorization to require ARC before making a broadband grant to request information from the FCC, NTIA, EDA, and USDA concerning the level and extent of broadband service in the area to be served and the degree of broadband service that may be provided by those other federal agencies; specifies that at least 65 percent of the funds used under this authority go for construction and deployment of infrastructure.
  - Requires that ARC provide notice to specific congressional committees three business days before the approval of grants greater than \$50,000.
  - Alters ARC's definition of North Central Appalachia by including within that definition the West Virginia counties of Brooke, Hancock, Marshall, and Ohio;
- Provides \$1.25 billion over five years in dedicated funding for the Appalachian DevelopmentHighway System (ADHS) at the Federal Highway Administration.
  - Prescribes that the formula for the distribution of those funds will be based on the 2021 Cost-to-Complete Estimate, adjusted by the 2013 Completion Report, as modified by the 2020 Future Outlook report.
  - Provides a floor of \$10 million per year for each state, except that no state can receive morethan is necessary to complete their portion of the ADHS.
  - Imposes a ceiling that ensures that no state will receive more than 30 percent of the funding.
  - Specifies that the federal share for construction of the ADHS shall be up to 100 percent.
- Creates a new Rural Surface Transportation Grant program and reserves 25 percent of the availablefunding each year for projects that will further completion of the ADHS;
- Provides that up to 15 percent of funds apportioned to states under certain provisions of the StateTransportation Block Grant program may be transferred to the ADHS;
- Creates a new Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment program at the Department of Commerceand specifies that ARC funds may count as the non-federal match for grants under that program; and
- Creates a new Digital Equity Grant program at the Department of Commerce and specifies that in establishing that program the Assistant Secretary shall consult with, among others, the ARC Federal Co-Chair.
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# 2. <u>Continuing Resolution Goes to President's Desk for Signature</u>

On December 2, 2021, Congress passed a continuing resolution to fund the government through February 18, 2022. The continuing resolution will go to President Biden's desk for

signature, and when enacted, will avert a government shutdown as the current continuing resolution expires at 12 AM tonight.

# 3. LDD/EDA 2022 Applications

The EDA Planning Grant has been submitted. The LDD Administrative Grant will be submitted by the end of the week.

# 4. Good Jobs Challenge

Southern Tier West was approached by Todd Tranum, MAST, to be the lead agency on an application to EDA for their Good Jobs Challenge. There are three components to this program, which will focus on the manufacturing sector.

Staff has been meeting and discussing the program and requirements of a solid application. We are of the mindset this application due mid-January 2022 would be for approximately \$6-8 million to be spent over the next three years. We are looking at a 6-county partnership including Potter, Warren and McKean counties from Pennsylvania.
