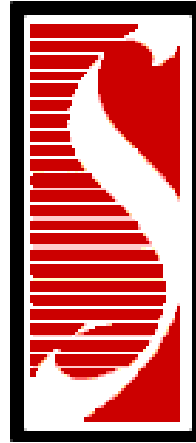

One purpose of this Model Solar Energy Local Law (Model Law) is to inform and facilitate local efforts to expand solar energy generation in a sustainable way. This Model Solar Energy Local Law regulates the installation, operation, maintenance, and decommissioning of solar energy systems. The Model Law is intended to be an “all-inclusive” ordinance to allow for a thorough review of all aspects of solar energy systems under typical zoning and land use regulations, including the State Environmental Quality Review Act. Municipalities are encouraged to review this Model Law, examine their local laws and regulations and the types, size range and number of solar energy projects proposed, and adopt a local law addressing the aspects of solar energy development that make the most sense for each municipality, deleting, modifying, or adding other provisions as appropriate.
